




Population




The 2011 Census population of Hart is 91,000. The population has increased by 7,500 since 2001, approximately 9.0%.

Age Profile




Between 2001 and 2011 there has been an decline in the percentage of the working age population from 66.8% to 63.3%. There has been a particularly large decline amongst young adults aged 25-39 (from 22.4% to 18.5%).

Age Groups



Most growth since 2001 has been in the oldest age groups, the 65 and over's increased by 41.2%. There was also a small increase in children aged 0-4 years (11.5%).

Ethnicity



90.7% of Hart's resident population are estimated to be of ethnic group 'White British' 1, those in other ethnic groups increased from 5.6% to 9.3% over the period.

Total Dependency has risen due to the increasing numbers of older and young people.


Population Density

There are 4.2 people per hectare living in Hart.

This is below the South East density of 4.5 but above England and Wales at 3.7.



Marital and Civil Partnership Status



58.2% of the adult³ population are married, a decline from 60.2% in 2001. Those that are single (never married) account for 25.6%, an increase from 25.1% in 2001.




Christianity remains the largest religion in Hart at 64.6% however it has experienced a large decline since 2001. The percentage with no religion has increased by 71.4%.

Country of Birth

90.4% of Hart's population were born in the UK, a reduction from 92.5% in 2001. The next biggest region is Europe at 3.9%.




Household Composition



Households comprised of married or civil partners account for 45.7%. One person households account for 22.4%, of which almost half (46.7%) are occupied by those aged 65 and over.

Tenure



Between 2001 and 2011 the percentage of rented households increased, alongside shared and outright ownership. The percentage of households owned with a mortgage or a loan decreased by 14.8% over the period.

The Child Ratio is the number of children and retired people to every 100 people of working age. The Old Age Ratio is the number of retired people per 100 of working age.

³Marital and Civil Partnership status refers to the population aged 16 and over.
