

**You will need:**

2 x old CDs  
(For new ones see pg 567 of the 2010/11 catalogue)

1 x pack of superfoam  
(red, yellow and brown used)  
(cat no. 814512)

Alternatively, the yellow and red pieces can be card, corrugated card, paper or felt, whatever you have to hand.

2 x wiggle eyes  
(cat nos. 209997 or 209098)

2 x pipecleaners  
(cat no. 204153)

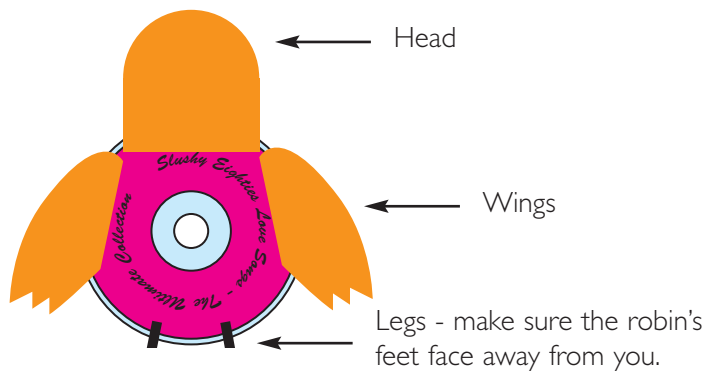
Double sided tape  
(cat no. 858511)

Thread for hanging

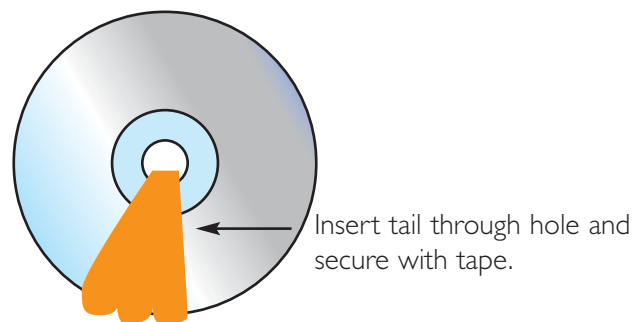
Scissors and a pencil

**How to make your robin light catcher:**

1. On a sheet of brown superfoam, lightly mark out and cut around the robin's head, wings and tail (see shapes on page 2). Using the same method cut out the beak from yellow foam and tummy from red foam, or other material if using.
2. Take a pipecleaner and fashion it into a leg - bend the bottom 2cm of the pipecleaner back on itself and twist, then bend the resulting 'foot' at 90 degrees to the 'leg'. Repeat with the other pipecleaner.
3. Lay one CD shiny side down and use double sided tape to stick the head, wings and legs in place so that the CD becomes the robin's body. With the legs, make sure that the feet are facing forwards so that the robins heels point towards you.



4. Take the other CD and, shiny side towards you, push the end of the robin's tail through the hole in the middle, bend the tab downwards and secure with double sided tape.



5. Using double-sided tape, stick the two CDs together shiny sides outwards, so that the foam pieces are sandwiched between them.
6. Stick on the robin's red tummy, beak and wiggly eyes.
7. Finally, attach thread to the top of the robin's head to enable him to hang up and turn in the breeze.
