

# Pig egg cosy

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Treat Mum to  
breakfast in bed  
on Mother's Day

## You will need:

Dark pink, light pink and brown felt (catalogue no. 209637 or 209338)

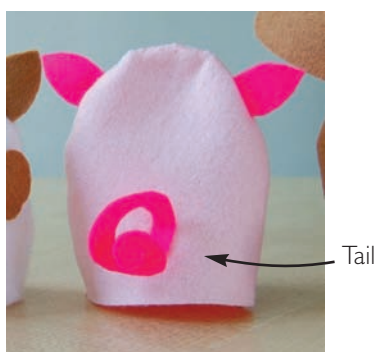
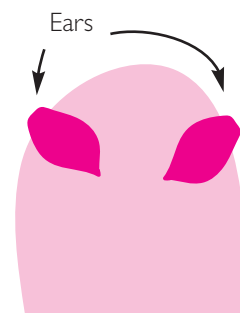
Sewing thread (catalogue no. 209950)

Needles (catalogue no. 209572)

Glue (e.g. Power Pritt Gel, catalogue no. 701702)

Black pen or felt tip

- 1 For the body of the pig cut two enclosed 'U' shapes from light pink felt. The straight edge should be 8-9cm long and the height of the 'U' shape should be at least 8cm.
- 2 Cut the ears from dark pink felt.
- 3 Lay one half of the body on a flat surface with the domed part at the top. Take both ears and lay them on the body so that the base of each ear is at either side of the dome and the ears themselves point down the body. Position the other body shape on top, sandwiching the ears in between. Use a needle and cotton to oversew the three layers together, leaving the straight edge open.
- 4 Turn the pig out the right way.
- 5 Cut an oval of felt for the nose from dark pink felt, and two round nostrils out of body-colour felt. Glue the nose on the pig's body as shown in the photograph. Use a black pen to draw two beady eyes.
- 6 To make the pig's curly tail, cut a small circle from dark pink felt and cut the circle into a spiral shape. Stick the end of the spiral to the back of the pig as shown in the photograph.
- 7 Decorate your pig with one or two mud splatter shapes cut from brown felt. Glue the shapes in place.
- 8 Your pig is now ready to keep your boiled egg warm!
