

You will need:

1 x sheet of brown or Silver Grey card
(cat no. 732613 (assorted colours)
or 732273 (Silver Grey))

1 x sheet of light brown miniflute card
(cat no. 814727)

2 x wiggly eyes (cat no. 209997)

Medium-sized red pom-pom
(cat no. 209314)

Black felt-tip pen and a pencil

Length of thin string
(eg. cat no. 849403)

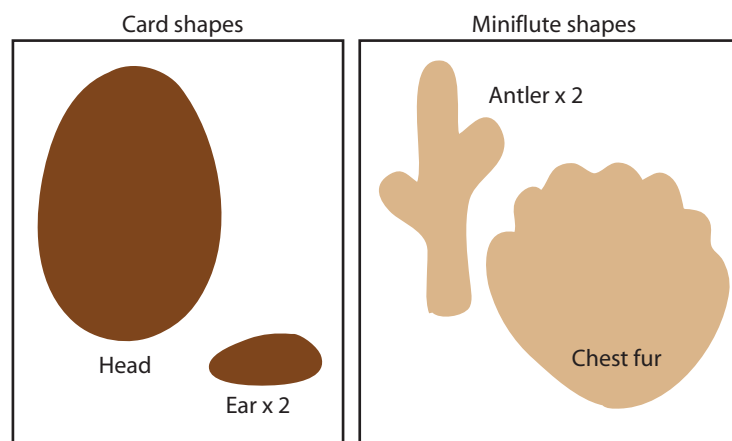
Glue and sticky tape
(eg. cat nos. 701702 and 858224)

How to make a basic cone shape:

1. Take a sheet of coloured card and a plate – a side plate is a good size to use. Lay the plate upside down on the card and, using a pencil, draw around the plate to make a circle.
2. Cut the circle out.
3. Fold the circle in half and cut along the fold to produce two semi-circles.
4. Twist one of the semi-circles into a cone shape and secure with glue or sticky tape. Save the other semi-circle for another cone decoration.

How to make a Rudolph Christmas Cone:

1. Begin by making a cone from brown card (see instructions above).
2. Make Rudolph's head, antlers and chest fur by cutting shapes from card as shown in the diagram.



3. Make up Rudolph's head by gluing an ear on either side as shown in the photograph. Next, add two wiggly eyes and a red pom-pom in the middle of Rudolph's face. Glue the antlers on the back.
4. Using a black felt-tip, draw a mouth under Rudolph's nose. Add in some whisker holes with a pencil if you wish.
5. Glue the head at the top of the cone opposite the seam (where you glued the edges of the cone together).
6. Stick the chest fur to the front of the cone under Rudolph's head.
7. Finish Rudolph by tying a loop in a length of string. Attach the loop to the back of the cone with sticky tape.
8. Hang your Rudolph on the Christmas tree!
