

You will need:

- 1 x sheet of black card
(cat no. 732223)
- 1 x sheet of Daffodil card
(cat no. 732510)
- 1 x sheet of Pink card (cat no. 732912)
- 1 x sheet of white card
(cat no. 732302)
- 2 x wiggly eyes (cat no. 209997)
- Black and orange or grey felt-tip pens
- Length of thin string
(eg. cat no. 849403)
- Glue and sticky tape
(eg. cat nos. 701702 and 858224)

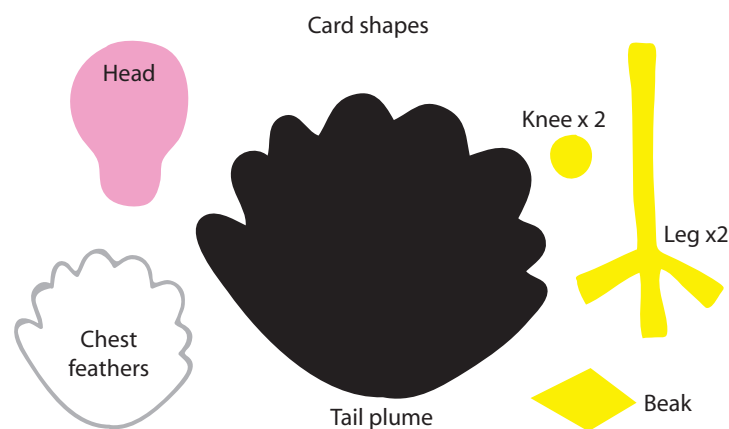


How to make a basic cone shape:

1. Take a sheet of coloured card and a plate – a side plate is a good size to use. Lay the plate upside down on the card and, using a pencil, draw around the plate to make a circle.
2. Cut the circle out.
3. Fold the circle in half and cut along the fold to produce two semi-circles.
4. Twist one of the semi-circles into a cone shape and secure with glue or sticky tape. Save the other semi-circle for another cone decoration.

How to make a Turkey Christmas Cone:

1. Make a cone using black card (see instructions above).
2. Make the turkey's head, beak, tail plume, legs and chest feathers by cutting shapes from card as shown in the diagram.



3. Glue the knees halfway down the turkey's legs. Using a grey or orange felt tip, make the legs look wrinkly as shown in the photograph. Put aside to dry.
4. Fold the beak in half along its width.
5. Glue the turkey's head at the top of the cone opposite the seam (where you glued the edges of the cone together).
6. Make the turkey's face by gluing on two wiggly eyes and the folded beak.
7. Attach the turkey's tail plume to the back of the cone, near the base. Then glue the chest feathers in the middle of the cone at the front.
8. Using a dab of glue, attach the turkey's legs onto the inside of the cone at the front.
9. Finish off your turkey by tying a loop in a length of string. Attach the loop to the back of the cone with sticky tape.
10. Hang your turkey on the Christmas tree!
