Arabic fell away in 2005 – 2006 but been rising since 2007 – 2008

Malayalam declining since 2005 – 2006

French no real pattern emerges

Urdu no real pattern emerges

Turkish fell away in 2004 – 2005

Spanish peaked in 2006 - 2007
