Agent Smart Limited <i>(Winchester based though project delivery Countywide)</i>	A Hampshire guide to lifestyle and leisure	This application seeks funding to support building the Agent Smart website which aims to enable people living in Hampshire to have easy access to as many lifestyle and leisure activities that are available, with a strong link to Hampshire's historic background. This project does not meet the criteria of the activity grant stream- the website project is not a cultural, recreational or community based activity and the organisation has not actively sort funds from other source. The application also states that this project has no financial shortfall. <b>It is recommended this application is rejected and the organisation is encouraged to look into venture capital funding.</b>	£5,000	£0.00
Parent Link <i>(Fawley)</i>	Band Camp	This application seeks funding to support the establishment of a marenning band 'samba' for young people, based mainly on drums but with some additional percussion. This project is aimed at engaging young people and families, in what has been identified as a deprived area and, after the training and purchase of instruments the organisation will be able to sustain the project by donations and weekly subscriptions. Councillor McEvoy supports the application. <b>It is recommended that Parent Link is granted £2,000 on the condition that this is spent on the hall hire and tutor time and the organisation seeks funding from other sources during the life of the project.</b>	£4,000	£2,000
Portsmouth Film Society	Southsea Film Festival	A three day film festival across major venues in Portsmouth and Southsea, showing eight recent films aimed at different audiences. This project does not meet the funds criteria. This organisation and project is based in the unitary area of Portsmouth and although the application states people from Hampshire will benefit there is no indication on how these participants will be measured. The project budget also has no financial shortfall. The organisation also requested £6,000 support which is higher than the finding limit of this scheme. <b>It is therefore recommended that this application is rejected.</b>	£6,000	£0

Wet Picnic <i>(Winchester based although project delivery in Eastleigh)</i>	Emerge Outreach	As part of Emerge 2013 (festivals programme) the organisation plan to work with local primary schools in Eastleigh delivering 50 workshops giving young people the opportunity to perform with professional artists in the heart of their own community. The organisation aims to create high quality art and theatre across the UK and through the Emerge Outreach project the professional workshops will introduce young people to the arts and local heritage, encouraging investment in exploring culture and identity. The project will have an increased impact for the individual participants using trained artists from a range of backgrounds. The organisation has connections with Winchester Hat Fair, the University of Winchester and The Point. Councillors Kyrle, Davidovitz, House and Broadhurst support the application. <b>It is recommended Wet Picnic is granted £4,450.</b>	£4,450	£4,450
