This will result in a series of curated exhibitions and events.</p> <p>The application and project is exploratory in nature. The organisation has an impressive track record of producing large and creative events in the community. This project is dependent on large amounts of funding being found from a variety of other sources.</p> <p><b>It is recommended that CCCA is granted £5,000</b> on the condition 10Days Umbrella provide evidence of match funding confirmation from Arts Council England and funding through Advertising/project submission charge/sponsorship in print project.</p>	£5,000	£5,000

This project is innovative, involves young people at all stages and more importantly there is vast amounts of learning to be considered. Young people are gaining quality life skills that may indeed save a life in the future. It will bring local communities together learning new skills which are unusual and delivered in a stimulating environment. This high quality event will generate 5,000 attendances over three days. This community based volunteering project targets 15-25 year olds in the Test Valley area ultimately aiming to improve their employability chances and in addition, as a result of the volunteering projects, improve the environment and social wellbeing for other members of their community. This project provides opportunities for local young people to be active in their communities. The project aims to be inclusive encouraging young people from diverse backgrounds including NEETs, young carers and those with disabilities- the vulnerable and disadvantaged. 30 young people will gain at least 1 accredited awards including Arts Awards, first aid, food hygiene, Youth Achievement Awards and V Inspired Awards. The majority of the project costs are for a 10 hour worker.</p> <p><u>Note:</u> TVCS also have submitted an application to Children's Services Integrated Grant scheme requesting £9,950 to support a Youth Participation project. This application is for 'engaging young people's participation in enjoyable and educational activities; reducing anti social behaviour while raising aspirations, volunteering opportunities and accreditations'.
