Queen Elizabeth Country Park 023 9259 5040

This exciting country park combines extensive woodland and dramatic downland scenery with magnificent views from the top of Butser Hill. A shop, café and visitor information point are located at the Visitor Centre. A full programme of events is available. There are also two excellent off-road cycle trails at the park.

Staunton Country Park 023 9245 3405

The park has waymarked walks, a farm, tropical glasshouses, an ornamental lake, mysterious follies and areas of open grassland and woodland. A shop, café, tea rooms and visitor information are available. There is also a full programme of events.

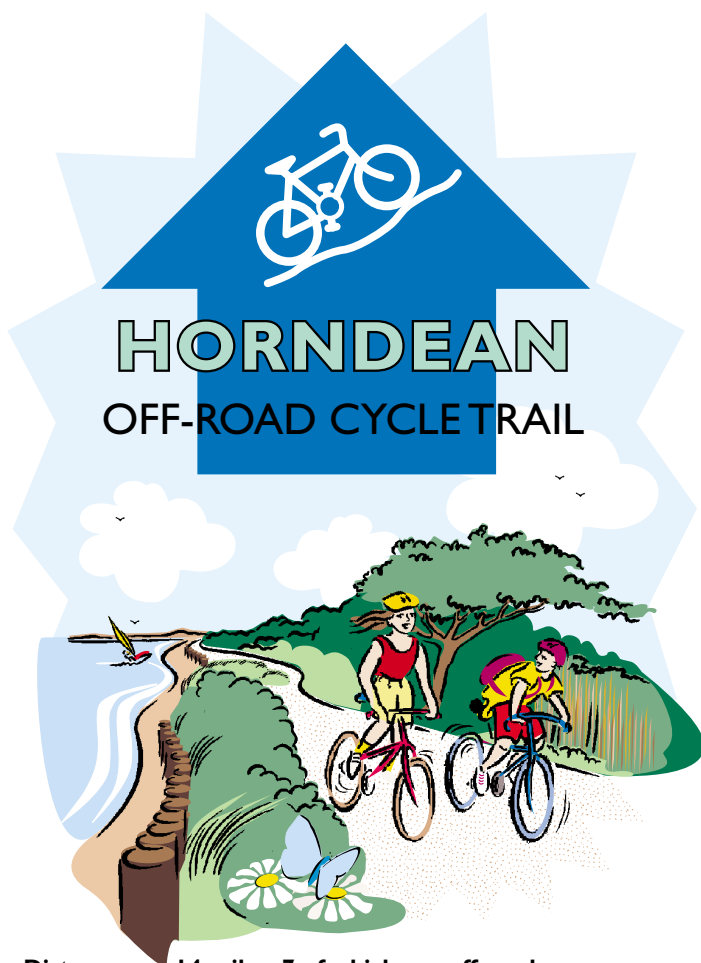

Distance: 14 miles, 7 of which are off road.
Short cut trail total 9 miles.

Start: Start at Denmead car park, between Hambledon Road and Kidmore Lane. (Grid ref. 659121.)
Alternatively, if you live in the Cowplain and Horndean areas, you can pick up the trail on Frogmore Lane or Catherington Lane.

Grade: Moderate

Description: A 'town and country' trail which joins Denmead, Cowplain, Horndean, Catherington and Clanfield with the surrounding countryside.

Meon Valley Trail (pack 1)

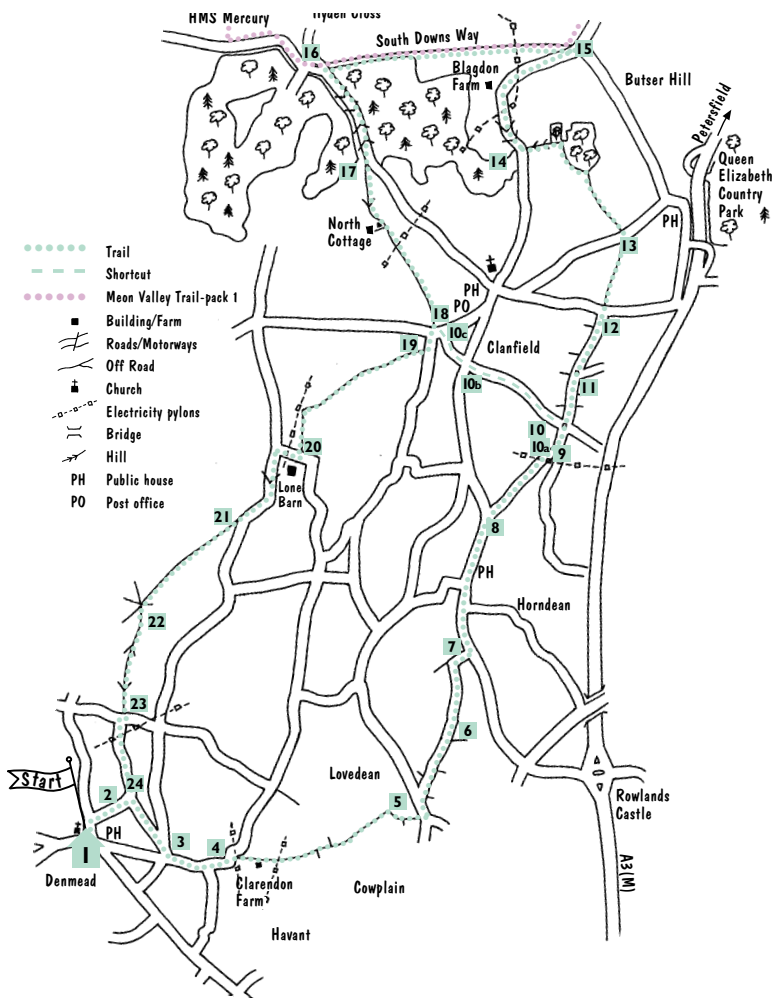

HORNDEAN Off-Road Cycle Trail

- 1** Start at Denmead car park (Grid ref. 659121) between Hambleton Road and Kidmore Lane. **Turn Right** out of car park into Kidmore Lane and **Turn Right** again into Tanners Lane.
- 2** At junction with White Horse Lane, **Turn Right** and continue to junction with Edney's Lane. Continue **Straight On**.
- 3** At Xroads, **Turn Left** into Anmore Road.
- 4** After 1/4 mile, **Turn Right** onto bridleway by sharp bend. Pass Clarendon Farm and continue passing housing estate and school playing fields to Woodcroft Lane.
- 5** Continue on Woodcroft Lane to junction with Lovedean Lane. The Green Dragon pub is on your left. **Turn Left** and **Immediately Right** into Frogmore Lane.
- 6** After 1/2 mile, the road sweeps to the right and becomes Stonechat Way. **Bear Left** at this point and stay on Frogmore Lane. Follow road round to right to T-jn with Catherington Lane.
- 7** **Turn Left** towards Catherington and continue for 3/4 mile, passing the Farmer Inn on the right.
- 8** **Turn Right** into White Dirt Lane.
- 9** Continue down hill to Clanfield. **Turn Left** at T-jn.
- 10** At roundabout next to Co-op, continue **Straight On** into Green Lane.
- 10a** **SHORT CUT**
At roundabout next to Co-op, **Turn Left** along Drift Road.
- 10b** At Xroads, continue **Straight On** to junction with Hambleton Road.
- 10c** **Turn Left** and **Left Again** into Hinton Manor Lane, rejoining main trail at Point 18.
- 11** At next mini roundabout, **Take First Exit** and then **Turn Left** into Green Lane.
- 12** At T-jn with Chalton Lane, **Cross Over** onto bridleway, which is also called Green Lane.
- 13** At junction with Petersfield Lane, **Cross Over** onto bridleway, called Thieves Lane. Byden Court is on your left. At woods, follow bridleway round to the left and then descend to road (North Lane).
- 14** **Turn Right** onto North Lane and continue uphill, passing Blagdon Farm, to Xroads.
- 15** **Turn Hard Left** onto South Downs Way and continue for 1 1/2 miles to road at Hyden Cross. *The route links with the Meon Valley Off-Road Cycle Trail (pack 1).*
- 16** **Turn Left** and follow road through woods for 1/2 mile.
- 17** Just before bend in road, **Take Track (byway) On Right**. Continue down hill, passing North Cottages on left. Follow right of way to Hambleton Road on outskirts of Clanfield.

- 18** **Cross Over** and continue for 200 yards.
- 19** **Turn Right** onto bridleway. Follow for 1 mile to road.
- 20** **Turn Right**, passing Lone Barn Cottage and then **Left** at T-jn.
- 21** After 1/2 mile, **Turn Right** onto track. This is 200 yards after a right-hand bend in the road. Follow this track, called Harrogate Lane, for 3/4 mile to a junction of several tracks.
- 22** **Bear Left** at this point (southwards), on a track called Sawyers Hill to road.
- 23** **Continue Straight Across** to minor road called White Horse Lane.
- 24** At fork, **Bear Right** into Tanners Lane and continue to car park.
