



Your guide to Lepe Country Park

Lepe Point Conservation Area

Follow the all access path to a view point over looking the Dark Water estuary. For the more adventurous follow the woodland path to see what wildlife you can find. Kids can explore further on the Wildlife Activity Trail, pick up a leaflet from the park office. To reduce disturbance to wildlife, no dogs please.



North Solent Nature Reserve

Enjoy views over the wetlands fringing the park. Look out for winter waders and special shingle flowers like the Yellow Horned Poppy.



Wild Flower Meadows

Have a wander through the secluded wild flower meadows, a feast for the senses throughout the year. Listen to the spring bird song, watch the butterflies feeding on the flowers in summer; see the birds feeding on autumn berries and in winter find out about the traditional practice of hedge laying.

Venture further afield to explore the local coast and countryside on the Lepe Loop. A 5 mile way marked walk taking 2 hours at a leisurely pace. Pick up a leaflet at the park office.



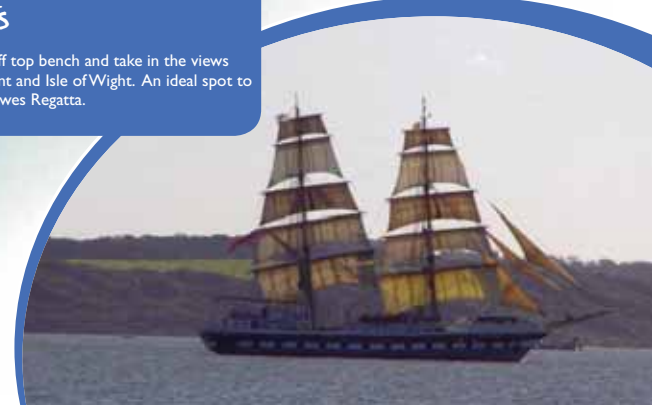
Birds

Lepe is a great place for bird watching from flocks of geese and waders feeding on the shore to the small birds busily feeding in the pine trees and hedgerows around the park. Information on wildlife can be found on the boards by the park office.
