Subject: **Renewal of fencing to portion of northern boundary with higher metal fencing and provision of fencing to section of southern boundary, at Fort Hill School, Kenilworth Road, Basingstoke, Hampshire, RG23 8JQ**

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the above application. The applicant seeks to remove a section of a northern 1.2m high timber fence and replace it with a 2m high metal fence.

After the construction of the fence has been completed, the fence will have no significant impact on the highway.

There is no indication as to whether the construction will take place during term time or school holidays- the implications will be lessened if the construction of the fence occurs during school holiday. Furthermore, there is no indication as to the timescale required to complete the fence, given its location on a Scheduled Ancient Monument.

If the construction is to occur during the school holidays, no further information is required

If the construction is to occur during the school term time, a Construction Management Plan is required, detailing the construction compound to separate pupils from the construction site, and contractor parking. No movement of vehicles will be permitted during the 15 minutes either side of the start and finish time of the school day, to minimise conflict with parents dropping off and picking up their children. Construction will not be permitted during the school lunch break, if children can get close to the Construction Compound fencing (if that area of the school is out of bounds during the normal school day then this is not necessary).

Parking will not be possible on Hawthorn Way, and in any event would not be appropriate.

Recommendation: At present, Insufficient information has been submitted to allow a positive recommendation to be given
