Is the development listed in Schedule 1? **No**

Is the development listed in Schedule 2? **Yes, 11. other projects (b) Installations for the disposal of waste. Site exceeds 0.5 ha.**

Is the development likely to have significant effects on the environment?

Planning permission has been granted for development at the Rose Bowl. The proposal is to export surplus material, which is not covered by the existing planning consent. It is not considered that there would any significant additional environmental effects as material would be removed primarily by backhauling, consequently no increase in traffic, and material and operations within the site would be the same and in the same area as already permitted by existing planning permission.

The proposed development is not an EIA development under the *Town & Country Planning (Environmental Impact Assessment) (England & Wales) Regulations 1999* as although within Schedule 2 and in excess of the 0.5 ha threshold, site is not in a sensitive area and is ancillary to the main development already permitted and is unlikely to have any significant environmental effects.
